Public Act 094-0600: During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of 3 school evacuation drills to address and prepare students and school personnel for fire incidents...One of the 3 school evacuation drills shall require the participation of the appropriate local fire department or district. During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of one bus evacuation drill. During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of one severe weather and shelter-in-place drill to address and prepare students and school personnel for possible tornado incidents and may conduct additional severe weather and shelter-in-place drills to account for other incidents, including without limitation earthquakes or hazardous materials. The school safety drill act was amended in 2009 to include a mandatory law enforcement drill. This drill can be a lockdown with a member of law enforcement on site like the districts do with the fire drill. The drill can be held on a day when only faculty are present if the district or law enforcement would like to do a drill involving their personnel such as a room to room search for a shooter
